As your children move toward their teen years, they become more independent. While it may seem as if they need you less, in reality they still need your help to be protected from devastating and often deadly vaccine-preventable diseases.

Many diseases spread more easily in community settings that adolescents frequent such as schools, locker rooms and summer camps. You can help your adolescents remain healthy by getting them vaccinated with the following five essential vaccines:





PREGNANCY

Pregnancy is such a special time for the entire expecting family. It is a time of planning and preparing for the birth of a precious child. It is also an important time to begin considering the steps you can take to keep your children healthy, from the moment they take their first breath. Did you know that your baby can be born with immunity to infectious diseases? By getting yourself vaccinated against diseases such as flu and whooping cough during your pregnancy, you are not only protecting yourself, but you are also passing immunity directly to your baby.

Before becoming pregnant: If you are [planning to become pregnant](#), it's important to make certain you are up-to-date on all of your vaccines. Vaccination against rubella (German measles) is particularly important, as the disease can cause unborn babies to have birth defects with devastating, lifelong consequences, or even die before birth. Before being vaccinated, women can have a pre-pregnancy blood test to see if they are immune to the disease. Most women were vaccinated as children with the MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) vaccine, but you should confirm this with your doctor. If you need to get vaccinated against rubella, you should avoid becoming pregnant until one month after receiving the MMR vaccine and, ideally, not until your immunity is confirmed by a blood test.

If you are already pregnant: Did you know that your actions while you are pregnant can enable your baby to be born with protection against dangerous infectious diseases? By getting vaccinated while pregnant, you can pass on immunity to your child that will last until your little one is ready to begin his or her own vaccination series.

Your healthcare provider, including your OB-GYN or midwife, can tell you which vaccines are right for you throughout your pregnancy, but the [Centers for Disease Control and Prevention \(CDC\)](#), the [American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists \(ACOG\)](#) and the [American College of Nurse-Midwives \(ACNM\)](#) **all strongly recommend the following two vaccines for pregnant women:**

WHY SHOULD I TALK TO MY HEALTHCARE PROVIDER ABOUT GETTING VACCINATED?

Vaccinations aren't just for children. They can help protect not only your own health but that of your family as well. This is especially important with a new grandchild or with one on the way! In fact, the recommended vaccinations for adults help protect them and their families from serious diseases, such as whooping cough.

AS A GRANDPARENT-TO-BE OR NEW GRANDPARENT, WHICH VACCINES ARE APPROPRIATE?

You should talk with your healthcare provider, such as a doctor, nurse, or pharmacist, about which vaccines may be right for you. Two of the vaccines recommended for adults who will be in close contact with infants are the flu vaccine and the Tdap vaccine, which helps protect against tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis, commonly known as whooping cough.

It is recommended that everyone who is in close contact with a newborn be up-to-date with their flu and whooping cough vaccines.

WHY SHOULD I BE CONCERNED ABOUT WHOOPING COUGH?

The United States continues to have outbreaks of whooping cough. Whooping cough is a serious, highly contagious disease that can last up to 10 weeks or more. It is spread from person to person, usually by coughing or sneezing. The disease may be milder in adults, adolescents, and children partially protected by the vaccine compared to infants and young children. In fact, many people may not even be aware they have it. However whooping cough can cause serious and even life-threatening complications in infants and young children, especially those who are not fully vaccinated.

About half of all infants under the age of one year who get whooping cough end up in the hospital. Sadly, approximately 1 out of every 100 infants who are hospitalized for whooping cough will die.

5 TIPS TO SOOTHE A FUSSY BABY

THE SOUND OF A FUSSY BABY HAS THE POWER TO BREAK ANY GRANDPARENT'S HEART.

It's easy to feel helpless when you've fed, changed, and cuddled your new grandchild but she's still uncomfortable. Here are a few other expert-recommended tips you can use to help soothe the fussy baby in your life – or to help keep the little one from becoming fussy in the first place!

COMFORTING, CLOSE CONTACT

Your grandchild is still getting used to life outside of the womb and may crave that feeling of closeness.

- Swaddling (wrapping the baby in a large, light-weight blanket), when done correctly, can provide the comfort your grandchild needs to feel safe. Learn the proper way to swaddle baby, and remember that swaddling is not recommended for infants older than 2 months or once the infant begins intentionally trying to roll.

BURSTING (GAS) BUBBLES

Little ones can often experience the discomfort of gas in their tiny tummies, but there are things you can do to help burst those bubbles, such as using bottles designed to remove air intake and maintaining fluids to see whether your grandchild is having a reaction to something he's eating.

- Laying your grandchild flat on its back and moving his legs in a bicycling motion can also help move any gas bubbles out instead of letting them settle.

YOU'RE ABOUT TO BECOME A GRANDPARENT?

Congratulations!
Now more than ever, it's important for you to stay healthy so you can spend quality time with your grandchild and watch him or her grow for years to come. Preventive care is a key to staying healthy and includes a balanced diet, regular exercise, and vaccinations.

DID YOU KNOW?

Getting vaccinated against diseases such as whooping cough may help protect you and your grandchildren. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends a series of 5 whooping cough vaccinations, with infants receiving their first dose at two months of age, and the full three of the series being administered between 4-6 years of age. It's also important that all family members, including grandparents, are up-to-date with their immunizations.

MORE THAN JUST A COUGH

Whooping cough is a serious, highly contagious, respiratory disease. It can last several months in adults, but in children and infants in particular, whooping cough can be more severe, and even fatal in a very small number of cases. Everyone, including adults and adolescents, may not know they have whooping cough since it can appear to be a common cold in its early stages; however, people are most infectious up to about 2 weeks after the cough begins and can unknowingly expose infants to the disease.

Babies who get whooping cough often catch it from family members. In fact, in one recent study of infants who contracted whooping cough, approximately 85% got it from a member of their immediate or extended family, when a source of the infection could be identified.

About half of all infants under the age of one year who get whooping cough end up in the hospital. Sadly, approximately 1 out of every 100 infants who are hospitalized for whooping cough will die.

The Tdap vaccine helps to protect against tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (whooping cough). It is the best way to help protect you and your family against whooping cough, but everyone should also practice basic hygiene measures, such as washing their hands and covering their mouths when they sneeze or cough.

Extended Immunization Deadline Enforced Strongly in Montana



- Although the action alert sent to advocates was to urge members to advocate for the Senate's funding level of \$611 million, with the passage of the budget deal and additional dollars expected for the Labor-HHS-Ed appropriations bill, our ask is back to our \$650 M – which is same level we requested during the spring to the appropriations committee.
- The continuing resolution expires on December 11
 - Likely the subcommittees will combine many bills into a large omnibus package

The AAP has announced their endorsement of the recommendation of the WHO's Strategic Advisory Group of Experts on Immunization pertaining to the use of thimerosal in vaccines. Three captivating commentaries accompany their endorsement of the use of thimerosal in vaccines. The first titled "Ban on Thimerosal in Draft Treaty on Mercury: Why the AAP's Position in 2012 Is So Important" provides the rationale for the call for the removal of thimerosal from vaccines in 1999. The commentary concludes with this decisive statement:

"Had the AAP known what research has revealed in the intervening 14 years, it is inconceivable to us that these organizations (AAP and USPHS) would have made the joint statement of July 7, 1999. The WHO recommendation to delete the ban on thimerosal must be heeded or it will cause tremendous damage to current programs to protect all children from death and disability caused by vaccine-preventable diseases."
